World Down Syndrome Day

Monday 21st March is World Down Syndrome Day.

Down syndrome is a genetic disorder. It occurs in

about 1 in every 1200 live births per year. Down syndrome occurs due to the presence of an extra chromosome. Instead of the usual 46 chromosomes, a person with Down syndrome has 47 chromosomes. This extra chromosome is found on the 21st pair, which is why World Down Syndrome Day is on the 21st of the third month of the year.

Tilly in Year 1 has Down syndrome so on Monday everyone at school will be learning more about what Down syndrome is and we are very fortunate because Tilly's mum Rachel will be coming to talk to us.

On Monday, we will be celebrating Tilly as well as our own personal uniqueness by wearing our brightest odd socks.
