This year we would also like to make a collection of food for the Penryn and Falmouth Foodbank in time for Christmas.

We will have a wheelbarrow outside of school in the

mornings for donations which will be quarantined before delivering. The last day for foodbank donations will be Friday 11th December.

Donations need to be dried or in packets or tins. Items that are particularly needed for Christmas are:

tins of meat, tins of potatoes, tins of veg, jars of cranberry sauce, gravy granules, dried stuffing, Christmas pudding, mince pies, tins of custard, tins of fruit, biscuits or chocolates.

Cornwall Xmas Box

The Cornwall Xmas Box drive is going ahead again this year, and it's arguably more important than ever.

The collection date is December 11th, in the Red Lion, Mawnan Smith. Families taking part are welcome to leave their boxes with Austen Osborne outside the school on this day only. Please do not bring the boxes in to school.

The response last year from the village was amazing.

Christmas Dinner in a box for the poorest families in Cornwall.

Collection day is December 11th.

Each box contains enough food for Christmas dinner with all the extra little goodies, treats like mince pies and biscuits, and of course Christmas pudding – which all go to make up a feast for a family in need. A typical box costs around £30-£40 but you can share the cost by getting together with friends, neighbours and colleagues to fill a box together. The boxes will be distributed by Cornwall Council's 'Children's Early Help,

Social Care and Psychology Service' team and some Children's Centres to families in need.

Covid-19

I think we are all delighted that Cornwall has been placed in Tier 1. We are all looking forward to the Christmas holidays and the opportunity to finally see our families. We'd like to remind everyone that it is essential that we continue to follow government guidance to keep our school community safe.

To keep us all safe please continue to follow our safety plans:

- If your child or anyone in your household is displaying symptoms or awaiting the outcome of a test, do not come to school - you must self-isolate the whole household during this time
- Maintain a 2 metre distance from other families and staff whilst at school (if this is not possible wear a mask)
- Do not come into the school building
- Arrive at the correct staggered time for drop off and pick-ups (only one parent to drop off)
- Swiftly exit the school grounds
- Do not gather in groups
- Follow the government's guidance outside of school at all times

If your child is isolating because they or a family member have Covid symptoms please ensure that you phone the school office. Please **do not** message teachers on Class Dojo in case messages are missed.

PARENT GOVERNOR ELECTION

I am writing to you to invite you to stand for election as a Parent Governor, or nominate another parent to do so. In our school we have provision for two Parent Governors and there is currently **one** vacancy.

The Governing Board, with the Headteacher, has overall responsibility for the running of the school. Governing Boards have three core strategic functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- Holding the Headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils; and

• Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

No special qualifications are needed and the most important thing is to have a keen interest in the school and be prepared to play an active part in the Governing Board's work. Training is available for all Governors and this Governing Board has an expectation that those new to being a Governor attend free induction training.

The information in the email summarises the circumstances under which someone cannot serve as a Governor. In addition, parents/carers who have paid employment in the school for 500 or more hours per academic year or who are elected members of the Local Authority are not eligible to stand in these elections. Nominations must be from parents or carers with children at the school on the day that nominations close.

If you would like to stand for election please complete the enclosed nomination form and return it to the school no later than the **10th December 2020.** You may also include a short personal statement to support your nomination, which should be no longer than 250 words. Selfnominations will be accepted, but if you are nominating another parent please seek their prior consent.

If there are more nominations than vacancies the election will be by secret ballot. If that is necessary, voting papers will be sent to all parents together with details of the ballot procedure.
