#### **Mawnan Wraparound Childcare**

We are thrilled to inform you that our after-school wraparound childcare has officially launched this week. Thank you to Sam and Joe for working so hard to get the club up and running. The feedback from the children has been incredibly positive!

This provision is in place to support you and operates Monday to Friday from 3:15 pm to 6:00 pm during term time (excluding INSET days).

Our wraparound childcare has been designed to complement our existing extra-curricular enrichment activities, providing a seamless and convenient solution for our families. The service is structured into three sessions: 3:15 pm - 4:15 pm, 4:15 pm - 5:30 pm, and 5:30 pm - 6:00 pm, each priced at £5.

To secure a place in this provision, parents and carers are required to complete a registration form, available for download from our website or collection from the school office. Once submitted to wraparound@mawnanschool.com or delivered to the school office, you will receive instructions on how to manage bookings through ParentPay Clubs. We kindly request that bookings are made at least 24 hours in advance, with payment required at the time of booking. Should you need to cancel, please provide 24 hours' notice to avoid incurring charges.

Parent Pay is unfortunately still not set up, we have been informed that set up will be complete next week. If you would like to book your child into wraparound club for the week commencing 28th April please email wraparound@mawnanschool.com with the days and times required and Sam will get back to you. Alternatively there is a form attached to the Newsletter email you can compete and return to the wraparound email or bring to the office on Monday.

If you are paying with vouchers, you will still be able to book via parent pay, your record will be adjusted with the vouchers and balance will be removed. Further information will be sent to you regarding this.

#### Key stage 2 tests

The statutory <u>key stage 2 tests</u> are timetabled from Monday 12 May to Thursday 15 May 2025:

**Phonics Screening Check for Year 1** children Year 1 children will complete their phonics screening check in the week beginning Monday 9th June 2025.

**Multiplication tables check (MTC) for Year 4** children Year 4 children will complete the multiplication check during the week commencing Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2025.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you about the importance of regular attendance, particularly during the statutory testing period. Therefore, I kindly request that you refrain from booking any holidays or nonessential activities during term time to ensure that your child is able to participate fully in their learning.

#### **Holidays During Term Time**

It is crucial that we maintain consistent attendance throughout the academic year to ensure the best possible outcomes for our children. In light of this, I kindly request that parents and carers refrain from booking holidays during term time.

The continuity of education is paramount to the academic and social development of our children. Interruptions to their learning can have significant impacts on their progress and can disrupt the cohesive learning environment we strive so hard to maintain. By ensuring your child's regular attendance, you are not only supporting their individual growth but also contributing to the collective success of their peer group and the school as a whole.

We understand that family time is precious, and holidays provide valuable opportunities for bonding and creating lasting memories. However, we ask you to consider the wider implications of term-time absences and to plan your family breaks during the designated school holiday periods. Thank you.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days.

If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days.

Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.
