In order to keep our school community safe, we will be following government guidelines as well as our school COVID-19 mitigation measures to ensure that our wonderful school community have the healthy, happy Christmas they deserve.

Both performances will be in the afternoon and will start at 2.15pm-ish to finish at the end of school. You are welcome to arrive from 2:05pm and PTA will be selling raffle tickets as you enter.

We will be asking all family members attending the performances to follow the government COVID-19 guidelines at all times and only attend if they are well.

Our COVID-19 measures in place will be:

- administer a lateral flow test before coming into school
- hand sanitizing on entry to the school
- face masks to be worn at all times (unless you are exempt)
- the hall will be ventilated, so please bring a coat
- families will enter from the main entrance of the school (the PTA will be selling raffle tickets so please bring some cash)
- collection of children will take place on the playground at the normal pick up areas and times
- do not attend if there is confirmed COVID-19 in your household or if you have been identified as a close contact or if you are awaiting a PCR result or if you feel unwell.

We realise that others may wish to see our shows so we will be recording the performances for you to share and enjoy. This will also form a back-up in case we have the disappointing news that we need to withdraw our "live" offer due to confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the infant classes.

Thank you for your help, patience and understanding, and we look forward to welcoming you to our festive offerings next week.

COVID-19 Update

There has been confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Pico and Fusion Class this week.

From the Department for Education

On Wednesday 8 December, the Prime Minister announced the implementation of Plan B of the COVID-19 Response: Autumn and Winter Plan, to reduce pressure on the NHS. Plan B sets out a number of additional measures across society to control transmission of COVID-19.

The Government is clear on the critical importance of not disrupting the education of children and young people and the Government will prioritise keeping all education and childcare settings open. The measures set out below will support this.

Attendance

School attendance remains mandatory and all the usual rules continue to apply. Enabling children and young people to attend their education setting regularly continues to be a national priority. As usual, schools are able to grant leaves of absence for pupils in exceptional circumstances.

Testing

We strongly encourage all those involved in education and childcare settings to continue regular testing (LFD not PCR) and reporting their results, and to encourage pupils and students in year 7 and above to test and report their results.

Settings are strongly encouraged to ask parents, guardians and other visitors to take a lateral flow device (LFD) test before entering the setting.

Isolation rules

All individuals who have been identified as a close contact of a suspected or confirmed case of the Omicron variant of COVID-19, **irrespective of vaccination status and age, will continue to be required to self-isolate and asked to book a PCR test**.

The Government plans to introduce Daily Contact Testing as soon as possible as an alternative to self-isolation for contacts of positive Omicron cases who are fully vaccinated or under the age of 18 years and 6 months.

Mawnan Measures

Until further notice our measures are:

1. Remain in our class bubbles whilst we are in the school building and key stage bubbles will only mix outside.

- 2. Routine and regular handwashing along with good respiratory hygiene.
- 3. Classrooms will be well ventilated.
- 4. Cleaning will be increased.
- 5. Staff will increase the frequency of lateral flow tests.

6. Staff will be wearing facemasks in communal areas and when working in close proximity to children.

Please ensure that you play your part and follow our guidance:

- 1. If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should <u>stay</u> <u>at home</u> and should book a PCR test (<u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow Test). If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test. If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to self-isolate. (The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated but instead should book a PCR test). Please let us know if someone in your household tests positive so we can provide support for you.
- 2. Please make use of the lateral flow tests Twice weekly lateral flow testing should continue for all education staff and all families and households of children attending schools. Please use lateral flow tests over the weekend to test the household before returning to school.
- 3. Maintain a 2 metre distance from other families and staff whilst at school.
- 4. Wear face coverings if you are unable to maintain a 2 metre distance whilst on school grounds.
- 5. Swiftly exit the school grounds and do not gather in groups.

6. Keep the one-way system clear so everyone is able to safely enter and exit the school grounds. To avoid crowding at the end of the day please could we request that you keep to the one-way system and **do not stand by the front gates**. If you are waiting for a KS2 child please stand in a space in the carpark (ideally stand in the same spot every day so your child can find you more easily).
