Punctuality

I would like to express my sincere gratitude for your continued support in ensuring our students arrive at school on time. Your efforts this week have made a significant impact, and we have witnessed a notable reduction in the number of late arrivals. This commitment to punctuality not only benefits your child's education but also instils valuable life skills.

Sextortion

The National Crime Agency has issued an alert to education professionals following a considerable increase in global cases of financially motivated sexual extortion – a type of online blackmail widely known as 'sextortion'.

Sextortion involves people being forced into paying money or meeting another financial demand, after an offender has threatened to release photos of them. This could be a real photo taken by the victim, or a fake image created of them by the offender.

Advice to parents and carers if their child says that someone is trying to trick, threaten or blackmail them online:

Don't pay, do stop contact and block: you may be tempted to pay, but there is no guarantee that this will stop the threats. As the offender's motive is to get money, once you have shown you can pay, they will likely ask for more and blackmail may continue. If you have paid, don't panic but don't pay anything more. Help your child to stop all communication with the offender and block them on any accounts that they have been contacted on.

Avoid deleting anything: try not to delete anything that could be used as evidence such as messages, images, telephone numbers, and bank account details.

Report to the police: call 101 or 999 if there is an immediate risk.

Household Support Fund Changes 2024/25

The entitlement criteria for automatic payments from the Household Support Fund is changing.

In order to be entitled to a payment from the Household Support Fund scheme in 2024, you must be responsible for at least one child and on 3rd June 2024 either:

- be entitled to Council Tax Support or
- have been placed in emergency accommodation by the Council

You will receive £80 per child. If you are already in receipt of Council Tax Support, then you don't have to do anything else – you will receive your payment automatically.

Why have we made this change?

Because entitlement to Free school meals has been protected since 2018, parents of children who are entitled to free school meals aren't always still on a low income. By using our Council Tax Support data, we can ensure that the Household Support Fund awards are going to parents who currently have a low income and are struggling with the increased costs of running their home. By better targeting the awards, we are able to help families with children of any age, rather than just school age children.

Families of children in receipt of free school meals can still access help through the Time2Move holiday programme. This scheme offers fun physical activities, games and wider activities plus a meal for all children during the main school holiday periods.

Penryn College Rising Stars – Rugby Programme

After the successful rugby academy offer last month, the PE & Lifestyles team have decided to offer additional sessions for year 6 students who will be joining Penryn College in September. There is no cost for these sessions as it forms part of our 'pre-season' sport offer we provide our current students.
